



Competition Terms & Conditions

1. By entering the 'Voice of the Planet Competition' ("the Competition") you agree to be bound by these terms and conditions.

2. Two major prizes of a week's watersports activities will be awarded - one in the primary category and one in the secondary category. Winning schools in each category will be invited to send 10 pupils plus one teacher/supervisor to the United Kingdom Sailing Association (UKSA) in Cowes, Isle of Wight.

The prize includes:

- Free accommodation and food
- Free activities and equipment
- Insurance
- Travel to and from Cowes.

3. The 'star' prize - a trip to join Gipsy Moth 4 on a leg of its voyage - is available only to pupils aged 15 or over, and will be awarded to one pupil of the winning school in the secondary category. The choice of pupil will be at the school's discretion.

The prize includes:

- Travel, accommodation and course fees for a 3-day UK training course prior to departure.
- Return flight to and from a UK airport to join Gipsy Moth IV
- Food and accommodation throughout the trip
- Insurance

The prize does not include travel costs within the UK to and from the UK departure airport. Neither does the prize cover the costs of any companion on the trip and there is no requirement to send one.

4. Dates for prize trips will be arranged directly between winning schools and the UKSA.

5. Entries must be made using Microsoft Photo Story (available free from www.microsoft.com).

6. Entries for the Competition will be accepted on a CD or DVD only. These must be delivered to BT Education Programme 'Voice of the Planet' Competition, c/o Dialogics, 249-251 Kensal Road, London W10 5DB, and must arrive on or before 18.00hrs June 28th 2006.

7. Entries must be submitted by a teacher, and must be accompanied by paperwork providing the name, address, and email address of the school and the supervising teacher.

8. Entries must be accompanied by a written explanation of how the project was approached. We'll be looking for evidence of research and discussion with others.

9. Entries may only be made by primary or secondary schools in England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

10. Entries submitted must be the pupils' own work.

- 11.** Schools may submit more than one entry.
- 12.** By submitting your application, you agree that we may publish any part or the whole of it at any time for publicity purposes, and that we may contact you in the future whether you are a winner or not. You are also confirming that we have permission to publish pictures of pupils if they are included as part of the entry.
- 13.** By entering the Competition you agree to take part in publicity as required.
- 14.** Shortlisted and winning entries will be selected according to the published criteria. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 15.** We reserve the right to change the number or nature of the awards offered at any time, or to vary the award amounts and/or other benefits as we deem appropriate.
- 16.** The information you provide in your application must be correct to the best of your knowledge. You warrant that you are entitled to send us all details relating to your application and that all materials are original and do not infringe any third party rights.
